Prunus laurocerasus 'Monarone'

Description:

A lush, evergreen, dwarf shrub, producing showy, fragrant, creamy white flower spikes in spring, followed by small black fruit; glossy, dark-green leaves have improved disease resistance; makes a stunning hedge or accent plant, takes pruning very well

Ornamental Features

Jade Enchantress Cherry Laurel features showy racemes of fragrant creamy white flowers with gold eyes rising above the foliage from mid to late spring. It has attractive dark green evergreen foliage. The glossy pointy leaves are highly ornamental and remain dark green throughout the winter. The fruits are showy black drupes displayed in mid summer.

Landscape Attributes

Jade Enchantress Cherry Laurel is a dense multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with an upright spreading habit of growth. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition.

This is a relatively low maintenance shrub, and should only be pruned after flowering to avoid removing any of the current season's flowers. It is a good choice for attracting birds to your yard. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Jade Enchantress Cherry Laurel is recommended for the following landscape applications;

Planting & Growing

Jade Enchantress Cherry Laurel will grow to be about 3 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 6 feet. It tends to fill out right to the ground and therefore doesn't necessarily require facer plants in front. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for 50 years or more.

This shrub does best in full sun to partial shade. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soils, and is able to handle environmental salt. It is highly tolerant of urban pollution and will even thrive in inner city environments. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.
